

## **Argentina**

- Any foreigner or resident who arrived in Argentina in the last 14 days from a country of active transmission must self-isolate and follow the required health measures.
  - Active transmission areas include the United States, China, South Korea, Iran, Japan, Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and Europe.
- Anyone who does not follow the mandatory quarantine and the health measures may be subject to criminal penalties. If specifically directed by Argentine authorities to remain in place, you must comply. The traveler may have to bear any costs associated with the 14-day quarantine period.
- The ban includes passengers arriving on transit flights with a stop in between.

## **Belgium**

- No travel restrictions have been implemented by the Government of Belgium in response to the COVID-19 outbreak. The Belgian Ministry of Foreign Affairs recommends against all trips abroad at this time.
- Travelers arriving to Belgium from abroad are not currently being required to quarantine.

## **Brazil**

- The government of Brazil has implemented a voluntary seven-day quarantine measure to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Travelers should prepare accordingly upon entry into Brazil. This policy applies to all nationalities and visa categories.

## **Canada**

- Canada has confirmed cases of COVID-19 within its borders.
- All travelers arriving in Canada are asked to isolate themselves for 14 days. If you develop a fever, a cough or difficulty breathing, call a health care professional or public health authority.
- New entry requirement now in effect: visa-exempt foreign nationals need an Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) to fly to or transit through Canada. Exceptions include U.S. citizens and travelers with a valid Canadian visa. Canadian citizens, including dual citizens, and Canadian permanent residents cannot apply for an eTA.
  - A visa-exempt foreign national is a person who is not a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident, and who does not normally need a visa to enter Canada.
  - You will need an eTA if you are from:
    - Belgium
    - Chile
    - Czech Republic
    - France
    - Mexico
    - Netherlands
    - Poland
    - Slovakia
    - Taiwan
  - eTA exemptions
    - Foreign nationals who are passengers destined to, or coming from, the United States on a flight that stops in Canada solely to refuel and
    - have proper documents to enter the United States, or
    - were lawfully admitted to the United States.
    - Foreign nationals who are passengers on a flight that makes an unscheduled stop in Canada.
    - Foreign nationals who transit through a Canadian airport under the Transit Without Visa program.
- Be prepared: Apply for an eTA before you book your flight to Canada. Most applicants get approved within minutes. However, some applications can take several days to process so don't wait until the last minute. Get help if you have questions before, during or after you apply.
- You need a transit visa if:
  - your international flight stops at a Canadian airport on its way to another country
  - you'll be connecting between 2 international flights at a Canadian airport
  - you'll transit through Canada in 48 hours or less, and
  - you don't have a valid visitor visa

## **Chile**

- As of 2 p.m. March 16, 2020, Chile has one hundred and fifty-six confirmed cases of COVID-19 within its borders. Travelers should be prepared for travel restrictions to be put into effect with little or no advance notice from both the national, regional, and local governments.

- Beginning on Wednesday, March 18, the government of Chile will restrict entry into Chile of all nationalities, with the exception of Chilean nationals and non-national residents.
- As of Monday, March 2, the Ministry of Health requires international travelers to submit a sworn declaration listing the countries they have visited in the past 30 days.
- Travelers who have visited China or another “affected country” within the past 30 days will be screened for signs of the virus by Health Ministry officials.
- Chile’s Health Ministry announced on March 14 the expansion of mandatory 14-day self-quarantine to all passengers arriving from Iran, China, France, and Germany, in addition to Spain and Italy.

### **Colombia**

- On Sunday March 15, the Government of Colombia announced that beginning Monday, March 16 at 12:01 a.m., non-Colombian citizens and non-Colombian residents will be prohibited from arriving in Colombia. All arriving passengers will be required to self-quarantine for 14 days.
- All incoming passengers must fill out a recent travel history declaration. This declaration can be filled out in advance of your arrival. The form is located here: <https://www.migracioncolombia.gov.co/controlpreventivocontraelcoronavirus>
- The Joint Center for Migration Analysis (CECAM) will be in charge of identifying travelers who come from or have been in countries at risk of contagion; China, Japan, South Korea, Iran, Germany, Italy, France, Spain, Ecuador and the United States, prior to their arrival in the country and raising an alert to the health authorities and the Migration Control Posts.
- Travelers from China, Japan, South Korea, Iran, Germany, Italy, France, Spain, Ecuador and the United States will be transferred to port health in order for the health authority to carry out the screening and determine whether a traveler should be transferred to a healthcare center or not.

### **Costa Rica**

- Costa Rica has 41 confirmed cases of COVID-19 within its borders, as of 3/16/2020.
- On March 16, the Costa Rican government announced that as of 11:59 P.M. on Wednesday, March 18, 2020, and continuing until April 12, only Costa Rican citizens, residents, and foreign diplomats will be able to enter Costa Rica. This restriction applies to land, sea, and air arrivals.
- Management of both airports that receive international flights (San Jose and Liberia) have protocols in place in order to deal with suspected COVID-19 cases.
- Puerto Caldera has also established protocol for suspected COVID-19 cases.
- As of March 16, anyone arriving in Costa Rica from another country must self-quarantine for 14 days.

### **Czech Republic**

- March 16 - The Czech government will impose a nationwide quarantine effective March 16 at midnight until March 24 at 0600 CET. Borders will also remain closed until March 24 at 0600 local time.
- The Czech MFA recommends that citizens of the Czech Republic, currently located in the United States, maintain contact with the airline with which they purchased tickets and to consider the possibility of early return.

### **Dominican Republic**

- 5 confirmed cases of COVID-19
- There are health screenings in place, and all arriving passengers must complete a travel history form.
- No quarantine policies are in effect.

### **Ecuador**

- Several positive cases confirmed
- Beginning March 16 at 11:59pm, all Ecuadorians or residents will be prohibited from arriving via air, land, or sea. At this time the restrictions will be in place for the following 21 days.

### **Egypt**

- Approximately 110 confirmed cases
- The Government of Egypt has announced a suspension of all air travel, both international and domestic, starting at 12:00 p.m. on Thursday March 19, 2020 until March 31, 2020.
- The Egyptian Quarantine Authority has placed staff at ports of entry to monitor arrivals. Passengers undergo a body temperature scan at the port of entry. Passengers showing possible symptoms are tested for infection.

### **France**

- Confirmed cases throughout the country.
- Since January 24, 2020, there have been 6633 confirmed cases in France. There have been 148 confirmed deaths.
- On March 16, 2020, the Government of France announced measures to minimize contact and travel. A containment system will be put into effect throughout France starting Tuesday, March 17 at 12:00 p.m., for a minimum of fifteen days.
- The Government of France announced that, as of March 17, European Union external borders will close for 30 days. Travel across the Schengen area's internal borders will be significantly restricted.
- Flights from China, Hong Kong, Macao, Singapore, South Korea, Iran, and affected regions in Italy arriving at Charles de Gaulle airport in Paris are met by medical professionals to answer questions and take into care any person presenting symptoms. The French government is distributing flyers to travelers with advice in French, English, Italian, and Chinese.

### **Georgia**

- Georgia has confirmed cases of COVID-19 within its borders. Most are individuals who contracted the disease in another country before traveling to Georgia, but some cases of local transmission have also been reported.
- As of Wednesday morning, March 18, Georgia will ban all foreign passengers from entering the country until at least April 1. Georgian citizens, their non-Georgian dependents, and diplomats will still be allowed to enter.
- All travelers arriving in Georgia by air or land are subject to medical screening including temperature checks and may be asked to fill out a locator form indicating where they can be contacted in Georgia later, if necessary. Travelers who display symptoms of COVID-19 may be quarantined as noted below.
  - Anyone who shows symptoms associated with COVID-19 (fever of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit/38 degrees Celsius, cough, shortness of breath) will be taken to the nearest infectious disease hospital for testing and may be quarantined for at least two weeks.
  - Anyone who tests positive will be held in quarantine for treatment that may last two to three weeks.

## **India**

- As of March 13, 2020, India had reported 75 confirmed cases of the novel coronavirus COVID-19, and one death.
- Indian nationals presently abroad are advised to avoid non-essential travel and could be quarantined for a period of 14 days on their arrival in India.
- All incoming international passengers returning to India should self-monitor their health and follow required do's and don'ts as detailed by the Government.
- All international Passengers entering into India are required to furnish a filled self-declaration form (including personal particulars i.e. phone no. and address in India) to Health Officials and Immigration officials and undergo Universal Health Screening at the designated health counters at all Points of Entry.
- Thermal (fever) screening, along with inflight completion of a self-declaration form (including personal particulars, i.e., phone number and address in India) and travel history is now being implemented upon arrival in India for all international passengers at airports and seaports.
  - Passengers who are symptomatic or screened positive for fever by automated fever scanners will be taken to designated isolation facilities for further evaluation and testing for the virus that causes COVID-19.
  - If the laboratory test is confirmed positive for the virus, they will be held at the isolation facility for further management.
  - If two consecutive laboratory tests of samples collected 24-48 hours apart are negative, they will be discharged after the symptoms resolve.
  - The information on these passengers will be shared with Ministry of Health and Family Welfare staff for further follow-up of these passengers at their homes for next 28 days.

## **Mexico**

- Mexico confirmed 41 positive cases of COVID-19 within its borders as of March 14.
- There are no entry or exit restrictions in place because of COVID-19.
- Mexico has implemented temperature-screening measures at some of its airports. Passengers with abnormal temperatures and travel to high-risk areas might be subject to additional health screening.
- Beyond standard travel documentation, travelers to Mexico do not require any additional documentation to enter or exit.
- There are no mandatory quarantine policies currently in effect in Mexico for confirmed or suspected cases.

## **Mozambique**

- No confirmed cases of COVID-19 within its borders
- The Ministry of Health has implemented screening at airports and other points of entry scanning the temperatures of all travelers and interviewing those traveling from countries where COVID-19 has been detected.
- The Government of Mozambique has instituted a 14-day self-quarantine for asymptomatic travelers arriving from countries affected by COVID-19.
- Travelers may be required to stay home for a 14-day period and will be assessed by a health ministry team. If they develop symptoms and test positive for COVID-19, they will be required to move to a health facility.
- The Ministry of Health has prepared an isolation center at Mavalane General Hospital in Maputo should any cases of infection be identified.

## **Netherlands**

- As of March 15, 2020, the Netherlands has confirmed over a thousand cases of COVID-19 within its borders.
- The Dutch government has banned all commercial passenger flights to and from China, Hong Kong, Italy, Iran, and South Korea.
- The Netherlands has no travel or consular restrictions to prevent the entry or quarantine of persons with recent travel to China or other affected countries.
- The Dutch government provides a briefing at Schiphol Airport to all travelers arriving from areas with a widespread outbreak of COVID-19 and possible risks.

## Peru

- As of 5:00 PM Peru local time on March 15, 2020, the Peruvian Ministry of Health (MINSA) has confirmed 89 cases of COVID-19 in Peru.
- Peru is enacting 15 days of mandatory quarantine, starting at midnight on March 16. Quarantine exemptions will include movement to obtain food and medical care. All borders (land, air, and maritime) will be closed as of 11:59 PM on March 16.
- American Airlines announced via its website on March 14 that it will suspend service from Dallas/Fort Worth and Miami to Lima, Peru effective end of day March 16, after flying all legs scheduled through the end of that day. This suspension will last through May 6.
- On March 13 the Peruvian government issued a decree to suspend all flights to and from Europe and Asia, beginning on March 16, for 30 days.
- The Peruvian Ministry of Health has implemented enhanced health screenings at international ports of entry.

## Poland

- As of March 16, 2020, Poland has 150 confirmed cases and three deaths due to COVID-19 within its borders. Country-specific policies within Poland may change at any time, as needed.
- On March 13, the Government of Poland announced that restrictions on international border crossings will be implemented for a minimum of 10 days. All international flights and rail connections (inbound and outbound) will be suspended from 00:01 on Sunday, March 15. **Polish citizens and foreigners with permission to work and reside in Poland who return from abroad will be required to quarantine for 14 days after returning.** All other foreigners will not be permitted to enter Poland. Road crossings remain open.
- The Government of Poland has announced other restrictions, including the closing of shopping centers (apart from pharmacies, grocery stores, and drugstores), suspension of restaurants and bars apart from delivery and take-out services, the closure of entertainment venues, and limits on all gatherings of more than 50 people. These restrictions are in addition to previously announced closures of all schools, universities, and cultural institutions, including theaters, museums, and cinemas, until March 25.
- Poland is included in the list of countries affected by a Presidential Proclamation restricting travel to the United States from the Schengen Area.
- Polish citizens are allowed to enter the country.

## Russia

- The Government of the Russian Federation has reported 93 cumulative cases of coronavirus, including the first cases of community transmission.
- Travelers from the United States to Moscow are now subject to a 14-day self-quarantine.
- Mandatory temperature screenings and other diagnostic and protective measures are being implemented at international airports and other major transit hubs. Inspections are subject to:
  - those who crossed the border in the last 14 days of one of the countries with coronavirus (China, Iran, South Korea, the USA, Great Britain, Ukraine, Belarus, European Union states and other European states that are not members of the EU); A sample for analysis will be taken by a medical professional.
- Report your return to Russia online, using the questionnaire or using the special hotline +7 (495) 870-45-09 (daily, from 08:00 to 21:00). This procedure applies to everyone who has returned from countries with an unfavorable situation for the coronavirus, even if tourists do not have symptoms of infection.
- The quarantine mode applies to all people who live in the same apartment. This will minimize the contact circle of potential carriers of the virus.

Тест на наличие коронавируса назначается только по показаниям и исключительно врачом медицинской организации – поликлиники, больницы или скорой медицинской помощи.

- Обследованию подлежат:
    - те, кто в последние 14 дней пересекал границу одной из стран с неблагоприятной эпидемиологической ситуацией (Китай, Иран, Южную Корею, США, Великобританию, Украину, Белоруссию, государства Европейского Союза и другие государства Европы, не входящие в ЕС);
    - лица, которые контактировали с заболевшим коронавирусной инфекцией.
- Пробу для анализа возьмет медицинский работник. Во всех остальных случаях анализ не проводится.

## Slovakia

- Slovakia has 63 confirmed cases of COVID-19 within its borders.
- Slovakia has closed its three international airports.
- Vienna airport remains open and accessible by car, though airlines are quickly canceling regularly scheduled flights. Operational status may change at any time. Budapest airport remains open, though Hungary has announced it will

close its land borders as of midnight March 16, 2020. International train, boat, and bus connections from Slovakia are closed. Private car companies and rental car agencies are operating sporadically.

- All permanent residents and Slovak citizens arriving from another country have a mandatory 14-day self-quarantine with permanent or temporary stay in Slovakia for those who return from abroad. Violation of the quarantine can face fines of €1,650 (\$1800).

### **Suriname**

- On March 13, the Government of Suriname announced one confirmed case of COVID-19 in Suriname and the decision to close all ports of entry starting March 14, including airports, border ferry crossings, and land borders. The ban on arrivals to and departures from Suriname will be provisionally valid for 30 days.
- There are currently no known restrictions on entering Suriname as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak.
- Travelers arriving at Johan Adolf Pengel (JAP) International Airport may be screened for signs of the virus by the Health Ministry.
- All travelers who come from a risk area and who are positively screened or show symptoms will be placed in quarantine for 14 days. All travelers who come from a risk area and show no symptoms will be advised to take voluntary quarantine for 14 days.

### **Taiwan**

- Cumulative total of 67 COVID-19 cases confirmed in Taiwan; 22 patients released from isolation
- All travelers arriving in Taiwan will be required to complete a health declaration form and accurately provide their travel and contact history over the past 14 days before entry.
- Travelers arriving in Taiwan should conduct “self-health management” for 14 days. This includes taking their own temperatures twice daily, minimizing time spent in public places, and wearing face masks when going out in public.

### **Ukraine**

- Ukraine has confirmed cases of COVID-19 within its borders and one confirmed death.
- On March 14, the Government of Ukraine announced that it is suspending all commercial passenger services, including flights, trains and passenger buses, to and from Ukraine for a period of two weeks beginning on 00:01 a.m., March 17.
- As of March 16, U.S. Embassy Kyiv will suspend all routine immigrant and nonimmigrant visa services until further notice.
- Ukrainians who do not have time to return home by March 17 should contact the Ukrainian embassies and consulates abroad if they want to return home.
- If a passenger is found to have a temperature of 100.4°F [38° C] or higher or flu-like symptoms, they may be referred to a hospital in Kyiv for additional testing and possibly up to 14 days of quarantine.

### **Venezuela**

- Venezuela has not confirmed cases of COVID-19 within its borders.
- Venezuela is implementing actions to identify possible suspicious cases at the Simon Bolivar International Airport, with the collaboration of the National Institute of Civil Aeronautics and the airlines that operate with international travel.
